Stayed for the rest of the night, too, being fed free beer from Stephan is always nice. ALLEE THE DIKTATOREN from Berlin were impressive, my type of music. Tight, sometimes sarcastic and entertaining punk rock poetry with a great show and dialog. Headliners FAH-NENFLUCHT from Niederrhein, demonstrating over 20 years as a top antifa-polit-punk force, perfect for the present crowd tonight. Great!

Singer just happens to be Andrew Kline, guitarist from STRIFE. Finally a sweaty stage-diving hardcore night which I have really missed lately.

Incredible show with all their hits like "Babylon's burning", "In a rut", "Staring at the rude boys" and many more to dance to. The opening band MORE KICKS I just missed; heard they were great. Fortunately, I did make it on time to see East Berlin's PLANLOS, who back in 1983 helped pioneer the DDR punk music scene, which took a lot of balls then. Forty years ago, they played a secret concert at a church in East Berlin with DIE TOTEN HOSEN, and this year in front of 60.000 with DIE TOTEN HOSEN at Tempelhof Airport. Respect well deserved. Tonight, at SO36, just plain killer!
